

Community Outreach and Education

WWALS submitted three short films to the VSU Causes Mini film festival hosted by the Anthropology Department on Saturday January 23. WWALS Working Hard for Your Watershed

At the quarterly WWALS Board meeting, after consideration of all the information provided by legal counsel, the Board voted that an appeal of Judge Canter's administrative decision would not be pursued. The complexity of the case and the risk of a financial judgement against the organization lead to the decision. WWALS continues to advocate that drilling in sensitive karst regions is not good for our community, the environment nor our members.

Members Chris and Deanna Mericle and Debra Johnson Randall were invited to speak at a Florida Sierra Club event on Saturday January 16th at the Suwannee River State Park to educate attendees about the risks associated with the proposed Sabal Trail pipeline and to point out misinformation and discrepancies in information that Sabal Trail is providing to FERC, DEP, and other elected officials. WWALS members Alton Burns and Lori McCraney also contributed to the discussion. Suwannee County Commissioner, Clyde Fleming, and Jessica Norfleet, constituent advocate for US Congressman, Ted Yoho, were present and interested. After the meeting the group hiked the pipeline route on the State Park property to see the active sinkholes that Sabal Trail failed to disclose in their survey of that site.
