WWALS Working Hard for Your Watershed

WWALS continues to oppose the Sabal Trail Natural Gas Pipeline, a 36 inch diameter pipeline that is proposed to be drilled under the Withlacoochee River in Georgia and several rivers in Florida, including the Suwannee. Sabal Trail is attempting to secure access to privately owned property for surveying and test drilling by suing for imminent domain in the courts. WWALS president, John S. Quarterman, penned and submitted a very thorough <u>Amicus brief</u> (Friend of the Court) to the judge in this case in order to inform the court of the multiple reasons that imminent domain should be denied and why the pipeline itself is a very real threat to our watershed and the Floridan Aquifer. http://www.wwals.net/category/pipeline-2/
