EXECUTIVE ORDER

BY THE GOVERNOR:

STATE OF EMERGENCY FOR HURRICANE IDALIA

WHEREAS: Hurricane Idalia is forecasted to make landfall in the early morning

on Wednesday, August 30, 2023, along areas of the Florida Gulf Coast and portions of the Florida Panhandle and is projected to travel northwest affecting areas in south central Georgia and

southeast coastal Georgia; and

WHEREAS: The National Hurricane Center forecasts Hurricane Idalia may

produce heavy rainfall, damaging winds, isolated tornadoes, storm

surge, and flooding in the State of Georgia; and

WHEREAS: This storm system has the potential to produce severe impacts to

citizens throughout south-central and southeast coastal Georgia; and

WHEREAS: Potential flooding, downed trees, power lines, and debris may render

Georgia's network of roads impassable in affected counties, isolating residences and persons from access to essential public services; and

WHEREAS: Preliminary reports from county emergency management agencies

and the Georgia Emergency Management and Homeland Security Agency indicate a need for assistance in the impacted counties; and

WHEREAS: Assistance from the State of Georgia is necessary to provide for the

public's safety, protect public and private property, and restore the

social and economic welfare of the State; and

WHEREAS: The Federal Motor Carrier Safety regulations, 49 C.F.R. 390, et seq.,

limit the hours of operators of commercial motor vehicles may drive;

and

WHEREAS: 49 C.F.R. 390.23 allows the Governor of a State to suspend these

rules and regulations for up to 30 days if the Governor determines

that an emergency condition exists; and
