shellfish harvesting and fish consumption) from Office of (e.g., Management and Budget review and the Administrator's continued failure to promulgate such new and revised numerical water quality criteria, the Alliance diverted a portion of its general operating funds to Waterkeepers Florida to support its Priority Toxics Training Program. This funding is provided to enhance Waterkeepers Florida's effort to mitigate the harm to the thousands of recreational and subsistence fishers, their families, and other persons, who consume fish and shellfish taken from Florida's Class II, III and III-Limited waters that receive discharges of priority toxic pollutants for which the Administrator has not promulgated new and revised water quality criteria to protect human health and the designated uses of Florida's Class II, III and III-Limited (e.g., shellfish harvesting and fish consumption).

52. The Alliance further resolved to continue providing funds to Waterkeepers Florida on a quarterly basis to support its Priority Toxics Training Program until the Administrator promulgates new or revised numerical water quality criteria for priority toxic pollutants in Florida's Class II, III and III-Limited waters.
