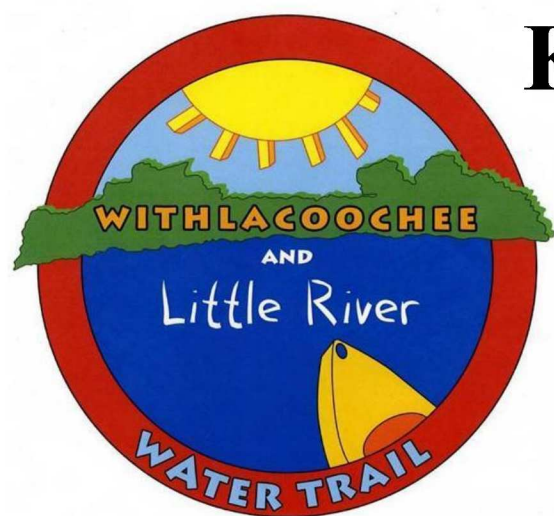

Downstream:

Water Levels on the Quitman US 84 USGS Gauge 02318500:

85.5' (2.0') lowest boatable: below, you may walk a lot

94' (10.5') highest safe: above, you can get lost in the floodplain

Difficulty: Watch for deadfalls (fallen trees), strainers (hanging limbs), and trash: typically, plastics, cans, or styrofoam.

Left, right bank (l. or r.): facing downstream

- 0 miles, **Knights Ferry** site
- 0.1 miles, **Knights Ferry Bridge piers**, remains
- 0.7 miles, Flowering *Cleome houtteana*
- 3.61 miles, Floating Marsh Pennywort
- 5.07 miles, River Bend Plantation Creek, r.
- 5.7 miles, **Redland Creek**, l.
- 6.64 miles, **Clyattville-Nankin Shoal**

Downstream Take Out:

6.65 miles, 4.5 hours downstream to **Nankin Boat Ramp**,
6899 Clyattville-Nankin Rd, Valdosta, GA 31605

Upstream:

- 2 miles, **Spains Ferry**, site
- 2.3 m., **Okapilco Creek**, r., drains Piscola Creek, Brooks & Colquitt Counties
- 8.2 miles, **Tiger Creek**, l.
- 8.24 miles, **Spook Bridge**, abandoned arched concrete road bridge
- 8.34 miles, **CSX Rail Bridge**, mainline Thomasville-Savannah
- 8.44 miles, **Quitman USGS Gauge**, on US 84 bridge

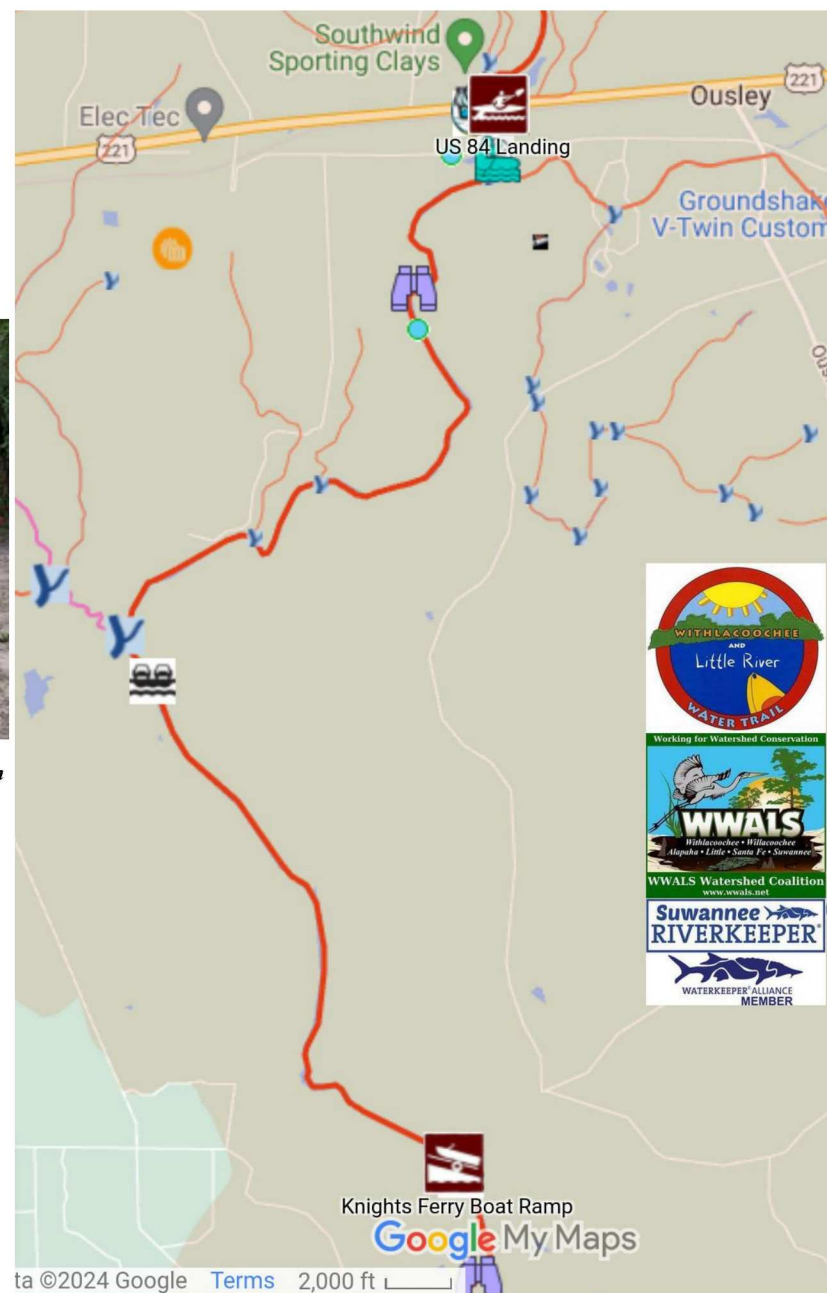
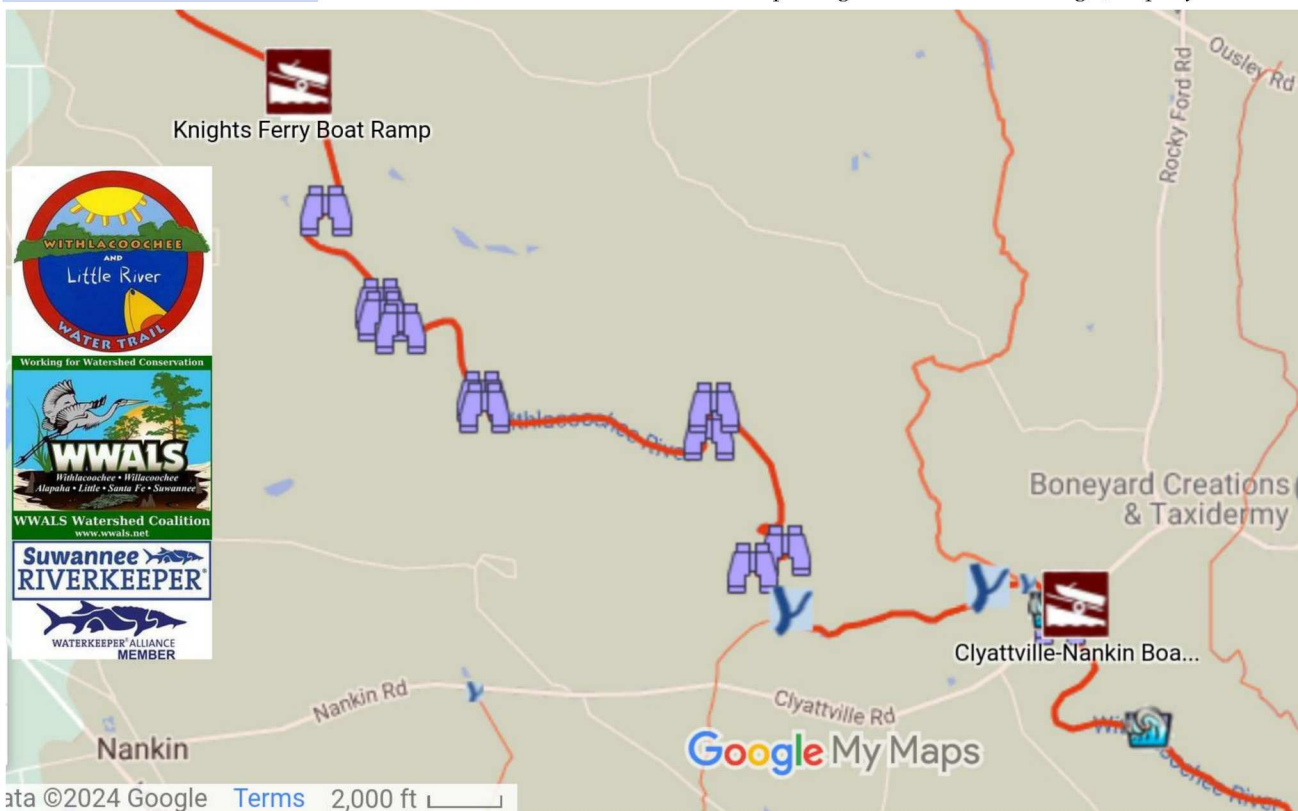
Upstream Take Out:

8.44 miles upstream to **US 84 (Quitman) Landing, l.**,
5092 US 84 West, Valdosta, GA 31601, notoriously difficult takeout up loose
highway abutment rocks between busy highway bridges.

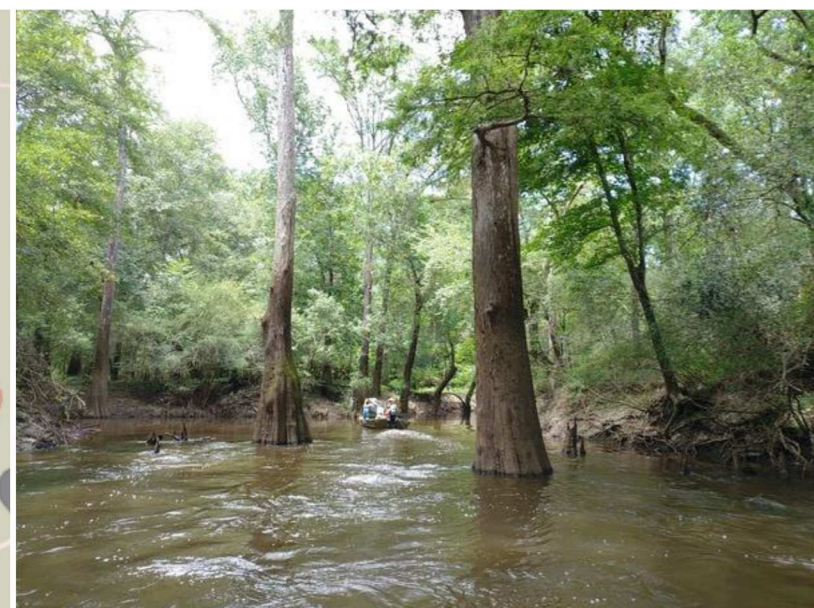
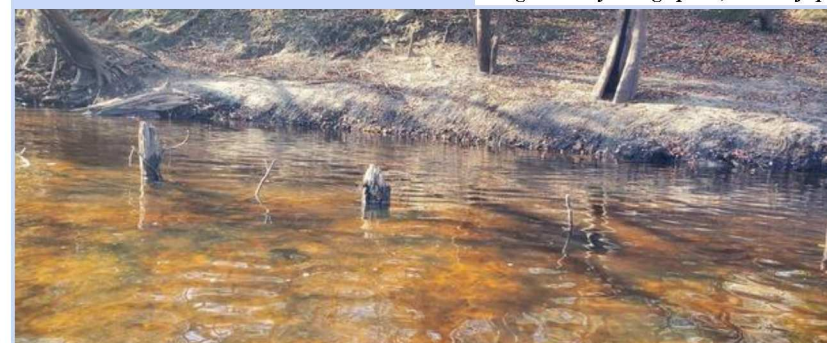
19.58 miles upstream to **Troupville Boat Ramp, l.**, on the Little River at GA 133.
