

Other costs that could be incurred by small businesses, small cities, and small counties, such as participation in a water conservation project, are based on the needs and decisions of the permittees and are not known on an individual basis at this time.<sup>214</sup>

THE CHANGES ADOPTED BY THE COMMITTEE:	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Removed the bill's provisions that made changes to Outstanding Florida Springs septic remediation plans, BMAPS, and septic systems.</li> <li>Required erosion and sediment control plans for the construction of solar facilities to include certain protections, rather than requiring DEP to develop BMAPS for solar facility construction.</li> <li>Revised the provision concerning Indian River Lagoon septic systems to extend the date by which certain commercial and residential properties must connect to central sewer or upgrade to an enhanced nutrient reducing septic system from 2030 to 2035.</li> <li>Removed the provision that granted DEP exclusive authority to execute coastal resiliency projects through public-private partnerships.</li> </ul>
